

# A Guide To Obtaining A Blood Sample

our kits contain enough postal boxes, biohazard bags and vials for 3 separate tests (if retesting is necessary)

1. Ask your vet if he/she will do a blood draw for you and what the cost would be, sensible prices at present seem to range from £6-£20 if you are quoted an unacceptably high price enquire with other vets local to you.



2. Take a vial that is included in our kits and fill with a minimum of 1ml whole blood (this does not require spinning) place in biohazard bag, fill in the required details on the bag and place in provided box, no other outer packaging is required.

3. Payment options are detailed on the biohazard bag which are Cash, Cheque, Paypal or Bank Transfer.

4. For clients sending urgent samples without our test kits acceptable vials are 1.3ml serum tubes with either a white top, clear top or a brown top gel separator a minimum of 1ml whole blood is required.

5. Separated serum is also acceptable a minimum of 0.5ml and is the only option when sending samples from overseas.
